

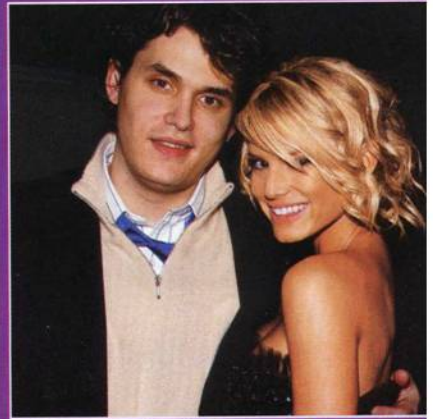
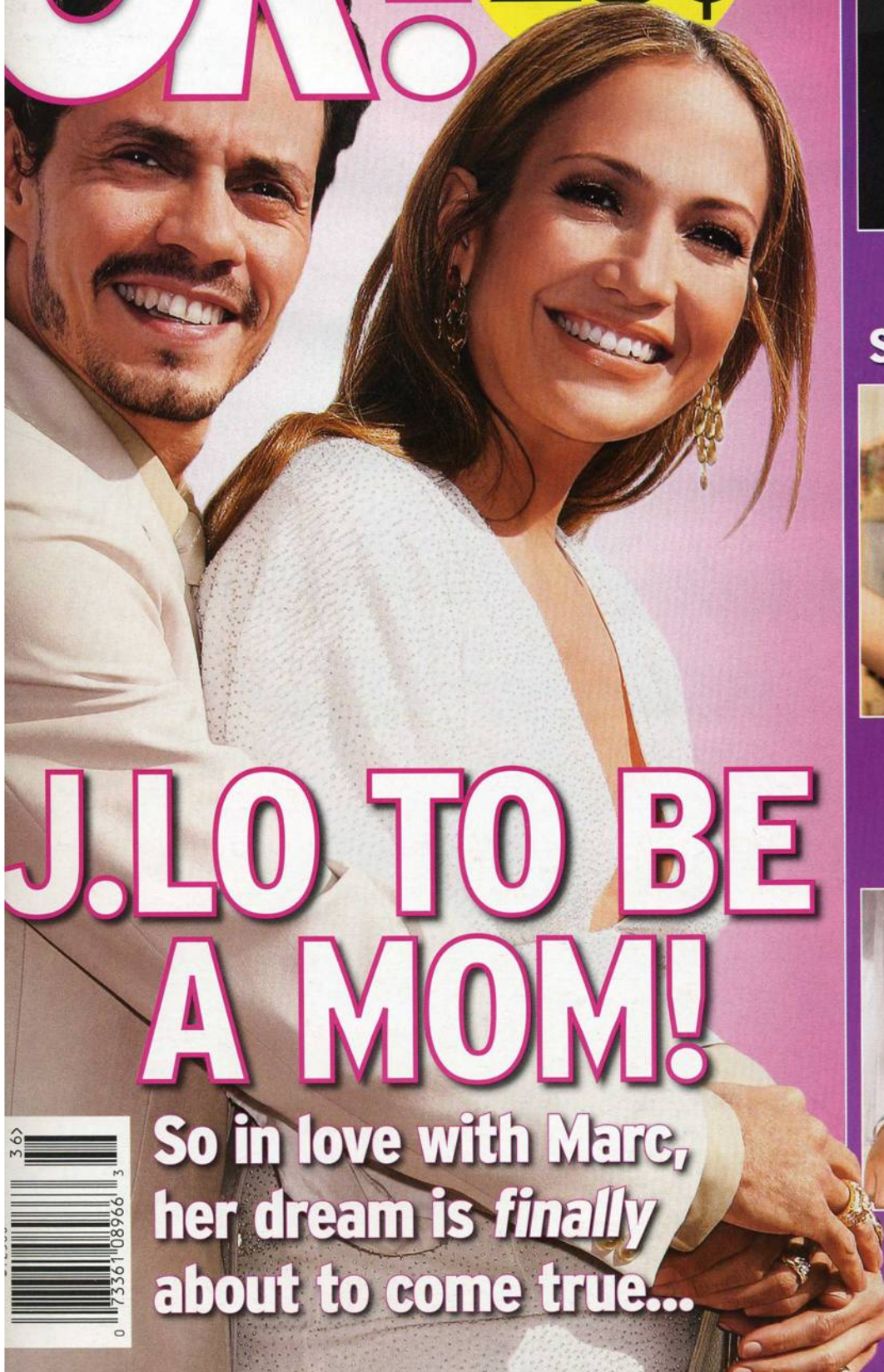

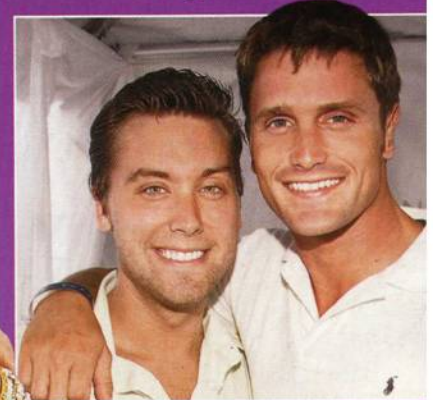

LINDSAY'S EMOTIONAL GOOD-BYE

THE ACTRESS TALKS TO OK! AND LOOKS BACK ON THE FILMING OF *GEORGIA RULE*

The Aug. 21 wrap party at Hollywood hot spot Avalon for the film *Georgia Rule*, which had been plagued with reports of tension, quickly turned into a roast, and no one laughed harder at the barbs coming her way than star **Lindsay Lohan**.

In the film, Lindsay, 20, plays a rebellious teenager whose mother (**Felicity Huffman**) sends her off to spend the summer with her grandmother (**Jane Fonda**) in Idaho. All three actresses attended the lavish bash, along with co-star **Cary Elwes**, director **Garry Marshall**, Felicity's husband **William H. Macy**, and Lindsay's pal **Steve-O**.

TIME HEALS ALL WOUNDS

"Someone gave Lindsay a watch for her 16th birthday," Marshall joked. "She still hasn't learned how to use it!" Jokes referring to Lindsay's well-publicized on-set excuses followed. Marshall compared her to an old grandmother because of her alleged illnesses, ailments and injuries. When a gag reel rolled, there were bits showing the other stars of the movie, especially leading man **Dermot Mulroney**, sitting around doing crossword puzzles, twiddling their thumbs and checking their watches as they waited for Lindsay to arrive on set. There was even some poking fun at the now-infamous letter from Morgan Creek CEO James Robinson chastising Lindsay for her "spoiled child" behavior and "late-night partying."

But when Marshall spoke with *OK!*, he had only kind words for his star. "She's a very instinctive actress. She can convey every emotion... It was a joy to work with her. She's a great girl."

Lindsay, of course, had equally nice words to share about the 71-year-old filmmaker when she spoke with *OK!*. "He's so sweet," she gushed. "It's like he's my granddad now. He's so funny and so encouraging. He definitely brings out the best in people. Jane and Felicity were also great to work with. I can't even say how much I loved working with them. It's a great movie."

An amazingly trim Jane, 68, was among the first to arrive, and when she spotted some of her crew, she quipped to *OK!*, "It's interesting to see how people clean up!" A bashful Felicity, dressed in workout clothes and with only a minimum of makeup, hung on to hubby Bill Macy as they made their way in. Surprise guest Steve-O, whose new movie *Jackass Number Two* opens Sept. 22, arrived with a small entourage moments before Lindsay, wearing a backpack. "I love going to parties and having my picture taken," **Nicole Richie's** rumored former beau confessed to *OK!*. "I don't even mind going to other people's wrap parties."

GIVING PROPS TO THE CREW

Lindsay, who sat at a VIP table with Steve-O, her assistant and a group of pals, puffed cigarettes, sipped on water and laughed loudly as Marshall told jokes and handed out fake awards. Lindsay also had a few words of appreciation to share about the crew. "I feel like the crew don't get enough recognition at times. They're such a great team of people, and most of them are the same crew who have worked with me on my other movies, so we're like family. I really love them. They do such a great job, and I don't know if people really appreciate them as much as they should." Once the presentation was over, a DJ took over proceedings and partygoers filled the dance floor, which was bordered by black-and-white stills from *Georgia Rule*.

'I'm always sad when I finish movies'

When the dancing kicked off, Lindsay was among the first on the dance floor, getting down with some of the kids who attended the party. She left beau **Harry Morton** to his own devices for a few hours, although she did join up with him much later for a pit stop at Hyde Lounge.

Three days after the glam wrap party, *OK!* was on the set with Lindsay as she filmed her final scene for *Georgia Rule* and said her good-byes to the cast and crew. It was an emotional day, to be sure. "I'm always sad when I finish movies," Lindsay said. "Sometimes I feel like I'll never see the crew again. But so many of them who are here with me now have been on my other movies. So for me, it is never good-bye. It's 'see you soon.'" — MARY ANN NORBOM & RYAN SMITH

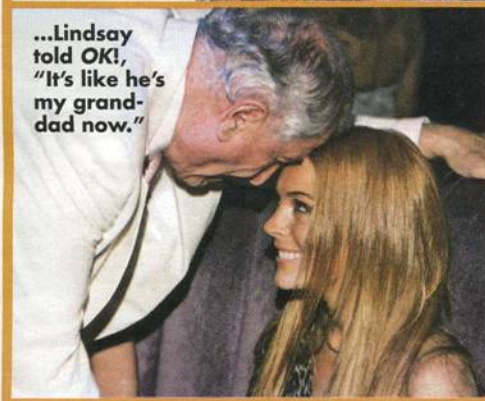
